the developing brain CTE is a brain disease that can only be diagnosed after death. It has been linked to specific changes in the brain that affect how the brain works. The research to-date suggests that CTE is caused in part by repeated traumatic brain injuries, including concussions, and repeated hits to the head, called subconcussive head impacts.
