These diagnoses mean that the person does not fulfil all the criteria for autism or Asperger's syndrome, but nonetheless has serious difficulties of a similar nature.

the development of autism Autism is the most common autism spectrum disorder. People with autism have differences in the development of their thinking, language, behavior and social skills. The differences appear before age three, and can be diagnosed by 18 months. For a diagnosis of autism, a child must have a specified number of symptoms in these areas:
