the development of foster city Bottom Line for Brain Development When children experience stable nurturing relationships, they foster the development of healthy brain and body circuitry. When children experience unstable, traumatic, abusive or neglectful relationships, they disrupt the circuitry of the brain's architecture as its being built.
